HOW TO WORK SIMPLE CROSSED STS

BY KNITTING THE STITCHES INSTEAD OF USING A CABLE NEEDLE



Of course it is always possible to cross sts traditionally, with a cable needle or without (In this case cross right would mean that the first stitch would be held at the back and cross left would mean that it should be held at the front, while crossing the sts).

I do prefer to twist them in the way described in this tutorial, not only because I find them quicker to work, but especially because they produce a much more elastic fabric, since this way adds more length of yarn to

This is why in the final fabric the twisted stitches are laying more relaxed and not as tight as their cabled counterparts.



Place Right Hand Needle (RHN) in front of Left Hand Needle (LHN) and keep the yarn in the back.

Skip the first stitch and insert needle tip knitwise into front loop of second stitch...










With RHN behind LHN, and yarn in back, skip the first stitch and reach from behind, in between the first and the second stitch...



Knit this second stitch but leave it on the LHN and then knit. the first one as usual.
