

PURLED CAST-ON (TWISTED)

HOW TO CAST-ON IN THE MIDDLE OF YOUR WORK

We often need to cast-on stitches during our project (at the join of Front and Back in Top-Down constructions or at the neckline for example).

The showcased method is easy and quick while producing a neat, sturdy and compact line of stitches that are perfect for picking up other stitches later and that looks like a knitted cast-on

When you arrive at the point to Cast-On new stitches...

...you first need to turn your work, since the stitches are Cast-On from right to left onto the needle...

Purl the first stitch...

...but pull the loop out more than usually, to give a little bit of slack...

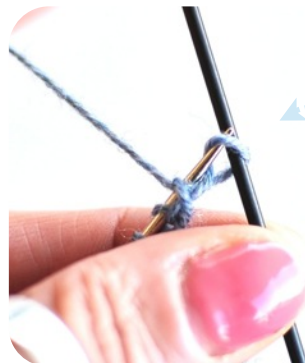

...this resulting stitch is positioned twisted back onto the left needle:

To do this, turn the point of the right needle a little bit to the right...

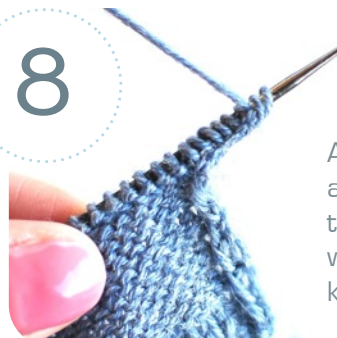
.. and position the stitch on the left needle. With this movement the stitch will be twisted.

Pull this first stitch tight and repeat steps 3-6 into this new stitch to cast-on the next stitch...

After having Cast-On all needed stitches in this fashion, turn your work and continue knitting as instructed.
